



For the National Immunisation Programme, the youth healthcare services (JGZ) ask your permission to share information with RIVM. This information concerns vaccination details together with personal details.

RIVM records which vaccinations you've been given and the ones you haven't yet received. This helps RIVM to protect your health. RIVM also uses this data to monitor public health.

If you **haven't received** a vaccination, a **reminder** will be sent to you.

You can easily **request a vaccination overview** from the RIVM. You may need a vaccination overview if you're going on a trip abroad. It can also be useful when visiting the doctor or hospital.

The youth healthcare services ensure that you get the right vaccine at the right time. **Afterwards**, RIVM **always checks** whether this went well.

If **something is wrong** with a vaccine you've been given, RIVM will **contact you immediately**.

RIVM **can monitor vaccination coverage**. And take targeted action if there is an infectious disease outbreak.



You must keep an accurate record of which vaccinations you've been given and the ones you haven't yet received. RIVM cannot protect your health properly. RIVM is also less able to monitor public health effectively.

You will receive a **vaccination reminder** even if you have **already** had that particular vaccination. Check your own records, or check with the youth healthcare services, to confirm if the reminder is correct.

You must keep your vaccination certificate in a safe place. RIVM will **not have an overview** of your vaccinations. You can contact the youth healthcare services to ask which vaccinations you had. But this isn't always straightforward.

RIVM **cannot check** afterwards whether you received the right vaccine at the right time.

If **something is wrong** with a vaccine, RIVM **cannot contact** you directly.

RIVM **won't be able** to monitor vaccination coverage as accurately. And won't be able to take targeted action if there is an infectious disease outbreak.

0-12

Only the parent's permission is required.
