Six months ago, your child had the first vaccination against HPV, the human papillomavirus. I am writing to invite your child to get the second vaccination against HPV. After this vaccination, your child will have effective protection. The vaccination is free.

Why is this vaccination necessary?

The human papillomavirus (HPV) is a virus that can cause cancer, such as cervical cancer and cancer of the mouth and throat. The virus is very common. Two vaccinations will give your child effective protection against the different kinds of cancer that can be caused by HPV. The information sheet about HPV offers more information.
