Subject: HPV vaccination reminder for your child

Best parent/carer of ,

Several months ago, you received an invitation for your child to have the HPV vaccination. According to our records, your child has not had the first vaccination against HPV. Your child can still get this injection.

Why is this vaccination important?

HPV is a virus that can cause various types of cancer in men and women. For example, cancer in the mouth and throat, penis, vagina and cervix. With the HPV vaccination, your child is protected against HPV in time. Read more on the information sheet.

Where and when?

In the envelope, you will find a letter from the Youth Healthcare Services (JGZ). It will tell you where and when your child can have the first HPV injection. Sometimes this letter already contains a date and location. Six months after the first vaccination, you will be invited for the second.

What to bring to the appointment?

- This letter (please keep this letter)
- Your child's ID card or passport.
- The vaccination certificate

HPV vaccine

From 1 September 2026, we will be using an HPV vaccine that protects against even more types of the HPV virus. Detailed information on the HPV vaccine is available at: rvp.nl/bijsluiters. After the injection, your child may experience side effects such as pain at the injection site for 1 to 3 days. Read more about side effects on the information sheet.
